In a sense, that brings us to today. We know that there is discontent in the Arab world toward the West, and touring Spain will help to explain why. The Arab culture was the ascendant culture in the middle ages as we'll see from the beautiful contributions they left behind. Like any proud people, they'd like to regain that glory.

To mention a few highlights: We'll visit the Prado Museum in Madrid, arguably the second most famous art museum in the world after the Louvre in Paris. A wine cellar en route to Granada. Three days, two nights in Granada to absorb the essence of the Moorish culture at its height. Seville, thank God the bulls won't be running in the street that time of year, and Cordova, the capital of the Islamic Nation in the west and where Ferdinand and Isabella took over and took charge. As we travel on our deluxe tour coach, we'll enjoy the same temperate climate we did in Italy.

You'll have plenty of opportunity to join in the ritual of *tasca* hopping: going from one bar to another and sampling the appetizers. Felipe II constructed this mammoth complex for "God and myself," with its splendid library, palaces, and some of the world's greatest art. You can spend a full day here, breaking only for lunch, as you wander the art galleries and state apartments, including the throne room.)

In the early evening, join in the ritual of *tasca* hopping, going from one bar or tavern to another and sampling hot and cold tapas or small plates of Spanish appetizers, ranging from fresh anchovies to the tail of a bull. You can discover plenty on your own, virtually on every street corner.



Day 4: Granada - Saturday, February 5, 2011

Continue for **Granada (260 miles , approximately 5 hours)**
(At the foot of the Sierra Nevada mountains, between the rivers Darro and Genil, lies one of the most interesting cities

in **Eastern Andalusia**. As well as its impressive Al-Andalus heritage, there are Renaissance architectural gems and the most modern facilities, fit for the 21st century. Granada has an unmistakable Moorish essence, due to the fact that it was the last city to be conquered by the **Catholic Monarchs** in 1492. The gastronomy, craftwork and urban planning are influenced by its glorious past. Fountains, viewpoints and “Cármenes”, houses surrounded by typical gardens of this city, create unforgettable corners in the city. It is no surprise that one of its old neighborhoods, the Albaicín, has been awarded the **World Heritage** designation, together with the Alhambra and Generalife. It was an important cultural centre for many centuries, under the Moors and the Christians too, and nowadays it boasts a broad **cultural and leisure program**.)

Day 5: Granada - Sunday, February 6, 2011

Buffet breakfast in the Hotel

Guided visit of the city, including the Alhambra, a beautiful complex of buildings and gardens. Its leafy tree-lined walkways provide pleasant shade and coolness, enhanced by the abundance of water that flows in its streams. It was the largest political and aristocratic centre of the Moslem West. The Palace premises are made up of beautiful rectangular courtyards and numerous fountains, as well as the Nasrid buildings that served as living quarters for the monarchs and their servants. The oldest building is the Alcazaba (citadel). One of the most important structures is the La Vela tower, which offers one of the loveliest views of the Alhambra. The courtyard of the Lions with its fountains is one of the most beautiful in the compound. The visit will also include the Cathedral. Diego de Siloé found the perfect way of combining a Renaissance dome with a Gothic floor plan. He joined the circular and basilica ground plans, which earned him the recognition of his fellow architects at that time. The main chapel encapsulates the greatness of this building. The dome of the main chapel is decorated with beautiful stained glass, sculptures and paintings by Alonso Cano. It has three very beautiful doors: Ecce Homo, San Jerónimo and El Perdón, the latter with excellent bas-reliefs of Faith and Justice. The main façade is Baroque, and the choir stalls are Plateresque. The side chapels contain excellent altarpieces and paintings.

Day 6: Granada - Ronda - Seville - Monday, February 7, 2011

Buffet breakfast in the Hotel

Departure for Ronda (115 miles , approximately 2.5 hours)

This town in the Málaga region sits on either side of the Tajo del Ronda, a narrow gorge more than 150 meters deep. Celts, Phoenicians, Romans and Arabs all inhabited these lands, which were conquered by the Catholic Monarchs. The historic quarter, reminiscent of the Arab age and with a medieval layout is scattered

to the south of the Guadalevín, while more modern Ronda, the part which sprang up after the 16th century, unfolds to the north of the course of this river. Several bridges unite the two halves of one of the most interesting towns on the route of the Whitewashed Villages, in the heart of the Ronda hills, only a few kilometers from the Costa del Sol.

In the afternoon, continue for Seville (**80 miles, approximately 2 hours**) Situated on the banks of the Guadalquivir River, Seville has a rich Moorish heritage, and used to be a prosperous port that carried out trade with the Americas. The streets and squares in the historic quarter of the capital of Andalusia are lively and busy. They treasure many constructions that have the World Heritage designation, and many districts are full of traditional culture, like Triana and La Macarena.

Day 7: Seville Capital of Andalusia - Tuesday, February 8, 2011

Buffet breakfast in the Hotel

Tour of Cathedral de Sevilla, the largest Gothic building in the world and the third largest church in Europe. After wandering the narrow streets of **Barrio de Santa Cruz**, the most evocative district, with its medieval streets, pocket-sized plazas, and flower-filled wrought-iron balconies or tiled courtyards. The visit will include the **Alcázar**, the other great architectural monument of Seville, which lies north of the cathedral. This is the oldest royal residence in Europe still in use, dating from the 14th century. The tour will end with the visit of the **Museo Provincial de Bellas Artes de Sevilla**, a converted convent housing some of Andalusia's greatest artwork.

**Day 8: Seville - Cordoba - Madrid
Wednesday, February 9, 2011**

Departure for Córdoba (90 miles, approximately 2 hours)

(Córdoba was once the capital of the Islamic nation in the West. **Mezquita-Catedral de Córdoba**, the greatest Islamic masterpiece remaining in the Western world. Its stunning labyrinth of columns and red-and-white-striped arches alone is worth the visit. With remaining time you can visit **Alcázar de los Reyes Cristianos**, a stellar example of military architecture where Ferdinand and Isabella once governed.)

In the afternoon, continue for Madrid. (250 miles, approximately 4 hours and 30 minutes)
